

POSTDOCTORAL POSITION IN CARDIOPULMONARY PHYSIOLOGY

Clinical Physiology Laboratory, Department of Medicine, Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry

We are looking for a postdoctoral fellow with experience in cardiovascular and pulmonary physiology for a 2-year CIHR-funded position in Dr. Michael Stickland's Clinical Physiology Laboratory within the Department of Medicine, University of Alberta. The successful candidate will lead projects examining 1) the cardiovascular consequences of obstructive lung disease, 2) whether exercise training reduces vascular risk in asthmatics. It is expected that the applicant will also collaborate with ongoing research in the areas of: 1) pulmonary circulation and exercise, 2) pulmonary gas exchange, 3) pulmonary rehabilitation.

We seek a highly motivated physiologist with a PhD in exercise physiology or related field, a strong track record of productivity, and the ability to work independently. Previous experience studying human integrated physiology and clinical populations is desirable but not essential. Expertise in exercise testing, pulmonary function testing, Doppler ultrasound, and cardiac function evaluation would also be helpful, although opportunities for training will be provided.
