



Bachelor of Education Degree (Secondary)

REGISTRATION TIP SHEET 2019

The Bachelor of Education Degree in Secondary prepares you to teach your major and minor subjects in secondary school (Grade 7 to Grade 12) providing minors are “teachable” subjects according to the Alberta Education Program of Studies.

The degree program is worth **120 credits**. If taken as designed the program will be completed in four years.

An example of the program requirements is outlined below.

Program Requirements

EDU 100, EDU 210, and EDU 211	*9 credits	NOTES: 1. One course is typically equal to *3 credits. 2. A full course load is *15 credits per term (normally 5 classes); however, students will be considered full-time if they are registered in *9 credits or more (normally 3-5 classes) per term in Fall/Winter. 3. Open Options are any course offered at the University, including Education courses. 4. Education Electives are any 300- or 400-level courses offered by the Faculty of Education (EDU, EDPY, EDPS, EDIT, EDEL, EDSE, EDES).
English/French Literature and Composition	*6 credits	
Open Options	*6 credits	
Major Teaching Subject	*36 credits	
Minor Teaching Subject	*18 credits	
Years 3 and 4 Education Courses	*15 credits

Your First Year

Everyone’s first year is unique; please ensure that you follow your personalized Program Sheet that was sent with your offer of admission to your @ualberta.ca email account.

Education Courses	*6 English/French Literature and Composition	Major	Minor
Complete EDU 100 in your first year, if possible, followed by EDU 210 and 211 in your first or second year.	It is recommended that you aim to complete these *6 credits in your first year. At least one course should be a Literature course (e.g. ENGL 102, ENGL 103). You can select approved courses from the following: CLASS 102, CLASS 221, Comparative Literature (C LIT), English (ENGL), FREN 301, FREN 311, FREN 312, FREN 313, FREN 314, FREN 380, FREN 462, FREN 463, FREN 464, FREN 467, FREN 468 or Writing Studies (WRS).	It is recommended that you aim to complete at least *12 credits from your Major in your first year. For your Major requirements please refer to your Program Sheet or to Education Chart 1 in the U of A Calendar.	It is recommended that you complete at least *3-6 credits from your Minor in your first year. For your Minor requirements please refer to your Program Sheet or to Education Chart 2 in the U of A calendar.

Tips for Creating Your Timetable

- 1. Create a balanced timetable:** Do not register for more than three courses per term with attached labs; you will have lab assignments and exams in addition to regular coursework.
- 2. Make sure to check prerequisites:** Some classes will need you to present certain prerequisite courses prior to taking them.
- 3. Take note:** Some classes do have a later registration date or registration restrictions. *This information can be found in the course descriptions on Bear Tracks or in the Calendar.*
- 4. If the class you want is full:** Simply put the class on your “Watch List” (found on Bear Tracks). You will be notified via email or text message if a spot becomes available in the class.
