Teaching Collaboration Award

The Teaching Collaboration Award is intended to recognize publicly teaching excellence that occurs as a result of the collaboration of instructors, to publicize such excellence to the University and the wider community, to encourage the pursuit of such excellence, and to promote informed discussion of teaching and its improvement at the University of Alberta.

Funds in the amount of \$3,500 will be awarded to be used for the further development and innovation of teaching within the teaching collaboration.

Eligibility

Collaboration may occur between or among members of different groups within the university and beyond and may include, but is not limited to: teaching assistants, technical staff, community partners, etc.. Collaboration may occur in a course team (e.g. a course comprising several sections) or other teaching projects that involve instructors collaborating in the design and implementation of instruction at the undergraduate or graduate level and who are actively involved in the delivery of instruction.

At least one member of the collaboration must be a Continuing Academic Staff from the following categories (as outlined in the <u>UAPPOL Recruitment Policy (Appendix A)</u>):

- A1 (Schedule A Academic Faculty Member, Schedule F Administrative and Professional Officers (APO) Member, Schedule B - Faculty Service Officers (FSO) Member, Schedule C -Librarian);
- A2.1 (Schedule D Academic Teaching Staff (ATS) Members (Career, Term 12, Term Recurring))

Selection Guidelines

The following was considered in the development of the adjudication criteria for the Teaching Collaboration Award:

- Evidence of a commitment to teaching excellence as outlined in the <u>Framework for Effective</u> Teaching.
- Demonstration of impact and creativity in teaching that enhances learning and engages students.

- Engagement with the commitments outlined in <u>Braiding Past, Present and Future: University of Alberta's Indigenous Strategic Plan.</u>
- Engagement with the institutional commitments to enhancing access, building interconnected and vibrant communities and promoting experiences of belonging for all members of our community in keeping with Changing the Story: An Integrated Action Plan.

Application Process

Two-Phase Application Approach

In **Phase 1** of the application process, we invite you to submit an expression of interest. This should introduce the collaboration to the committee, describe how the collaboration engages with the institutional commitments outlined in <u>Braiding Past, Present and Future: University of Alberta's Indigenous Strategic Plan</u> and our institutional commitments to enhancing access, building interconnected and vibrant communities and promoting experiences of belonging for all members of our community in keeping with <u>Changing the Story: An Integrated Action Plan</u>. Your expression of interest should also highlight the collaboration's commitment and dedication to excellence in teaching. Those selected to advance to **Phase 2** will be asked to provide a detailed narrative application, including specific evidence that demonstrates excellence in these areas.

In other words, Phase 1 is about introducing the collaboration and its story, and Phase 2 is about diving deeper and providing concrete examples and evidence to support that story.

The application template is designed to provide guidance on the criteria and specific information that should be included in your submission.
